2024 Price Trends: Tax Rebates & Import Changes

South Korea's new Green Industry Act (effective March 2024) offers 5-7% tax rebates for bits used in renewable energy projects. However, import duties rose 2.8% on Chinese tools to boost local manufacturing. For budget planning:

Actionable Buying Guide

Want the best drilling bits without overpaying? First, clarify your project's hardness scale (Mohs 1-10). For soft soil (Mohs 2-4), steel or alloy bits from China's Yikuang Drilling Tools work at \$80-\$200. For hard rock (Mohs 7+), try Korea's Durex Corp - their diamond bits last 3x longer but cost \$1,700-\$3,200. Second, always ask for local certifications like KS B 0801. Lastly, check if suppliers include free resharpenering - it can save \$40-\$120 per bit over 6 months.

Most buyers forget one thing: Supplier agreements matter more than upfront price. A Busan drilling contractor reduced downtime by 40% by partnering with a supplier offering same-day replacement guarantees. The takeaway? Focus on lifetime costs, not just sticker prices. Start comparing quotations this week - some wholesalers offer "early 2024" discounts until April 30.
