Pro Tip for Bargain Hunters

Ask suppliers about "project leftovers" - rods used for less than 500 operational hours. These often sell at 60% of new prices but function like 90% efficiency models. Trondheim's TBM Equipment has 23 such units available this week.

Remember: Norway's new sustainable construction policies mean demand will keep rising. Get your drilling rod price quotation now before summer's infrastructure projects begin. Most suppliers offer free logistics within 300km for bulk orders over 50 units.
