Smart Buying Checklist

Before requesting a quotation, ask suppliers these 3 questions:

- ? "Can I test the rig's torque output onsite?"
- ? "What's included in the price (shipping, GST, etc.)?"
- ? "Do you offer trade-in for our old equipment?"

Pro tip: Many Singapore suppliers now accept staggered payments. At United Heavy Equipment, 45% of used rig sales in Q1 2024 used 60-day installment plans.

Where to Find Reliable Deals

Local platforms like secondhandmachines.sg list 50+ rigs weekly. For export-grade units:

- ? Germany-sourced rigs: 15% pricier but 25% longer lifespan
- ? China-made models: Budget-friendly (avg. price SGD 75k) but check CE marks
- ? Japanese Tier-2 brands: Best under-SGD 100k options
