Always compare quotation details: One Galle buyer found a rig listed at \$55K actually required \$12K in spare parts - a cost buried in Section 8 of the contract. With infrastructure projects booming from Jaffna to Hambantota, timing your purchase could save thousands before 2025 budgets get allocated.
